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## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

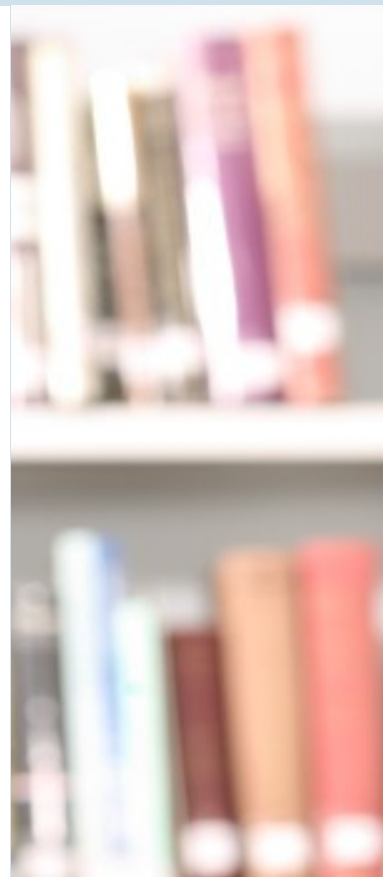

Our Fall Program was an MLA webinar titled "Predatory Publishing 101: What Every Medical Librarian Should Know." The session was informative and hands-on, showing participants what to look for and tools they can use to help determine if a publication is predatory.

Predatory publishing is an ever-evolving problem in the health sciences. It exploits researchers for profit and undermines the integrity of scholarly work. These publishers charge high fees, provide little or no peer review, and often make false claims about impact or indexing. As a result, low-quality or misleading research can be published, wasting time and money, damaging researchers' reputations, and eroding trust in scientific and scholarly information.

Predatory publishers continue to change their tactics to stay ahead of researchers, especially as awareness of their practices has increased. As health sciences librarians we have to continue to learn about these new practices and new tools so we can help our patrons identify and avoid these companies. I encourage everyone who was not able to attend the webinar to register for it the next time it runs.

On page 4, I've included tools and other resources provided by the webinar presenters to help determine if a publisher is predatory or legitimate. Thanks for (careful) reading!

## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE (CONT.)

Common characteristics of a predatory journal:

- The title often mimics more reputable journals with a similar title
- The scope is often unusually broad
- The journal can be difficult to find via Google
- The email of the editor may not be professional (John@gmail.com)
- The journal is not up front about publishing fees
- It has a misleading metric (such as IndexCopernicus)
- It features an unusually fast turnaround time

Tools to help determine if a publisher is predatory or legitimate:

**Allowlist:** Inclusion on these lists is a positive sign.

Jeffrey Beall, then a librarian at the University of Colorado, was instrumental in identifying and describing predatory publishing (a term he coined in 2009). Beall took down his list in 2017, but an anonymous person has set up an archived version, and updated it with additional journals and publishers as of 2024-2025.

## HISTORY OF MDMLG

The Metropolitan Detroit Medical Library Group (MDMLG) can trace its roots to the Biological Sciences Group established by the Michigan Chapter of the Special Libraries Association in 1946. It existed primarily as a social group until the mid-1950s when the members began to experiment with various projects. During the 1960s, several plans came into fruition including the production of a serial locator tool, the creation of a union catalog of monographs, and the establishment of an active interlibrary loan network. The group began the process of formal organization and chose its current name in 1970.
